To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Isaac Leabo of New County,
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lexington,
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Isaac Leabo
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the North West quarter of the Section 36, by line in Township 11, by from, or Range
 Twenty Eight, in the Eastern Range, to wit in Lexington City, said containing 100
 acres
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Isaac Leabo

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Isaac Leabo
 and to his heirs, the said tract above described.
 To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said
 Isaac Leabo
 and to his heirs and assigns forever.
